

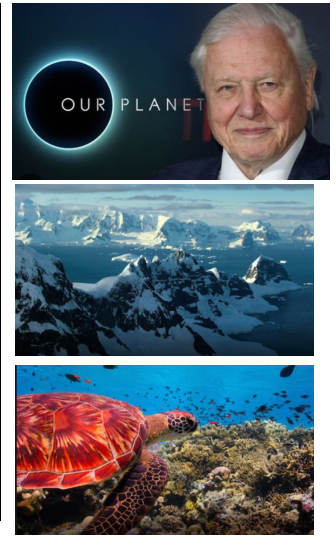

2. Frozen Worlds - On the unforgiving frontier of climate change, polar bears, walruses, seals and penguins find their icy Edens in peril.

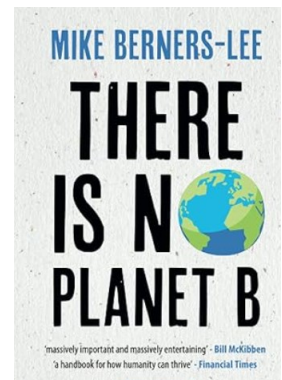
