Dear Families,

COVID Clarification

You may be aware that cases of COVID have increased nationally over the last week or so and we have seen a similar trend in school. Currently whilst there is no longer a legal obligation to self-isolate the advice from the government is for people to self-isolate if they are COVID positive.

If a student is positive for COVID you may begin taking LFTs from 5 days after your symptoms started (or from when they test positive if they have no symptoms) followed by another LFT test the next day. If both of these are negative, then you may return to school. As always, staff are uploading lesson materials onto Teams so students should be able to access any work they miss and complete this at home if they are well enough to.

We are currently experiencing staff absence due to Covid which is resulting in additional cover in lessons for students. We would like to thank you all for your patience and understanding over this.
